The ninth biennial edition of Kosmopolis aims to offer a close-up of the profound changes in sensitivity that are taking place as the planet's temperature continues to increase. Change in culture and culture of change, era of changes and change of era. The anthropocentric view, the comprehension of non-human intelligence and the scale on which we measure our acts are all changing. The conception of genders is changing, defending a creativity that transcends androcentric hegemony. The social and geopolitical map, and the way of assuming diagnoses and solutions are also changing. And it is also the inalterable reserve of empathy and amazement that we still have available for inhabiting the world.

Is literary creation an exercise of permanent change? How do the works of writers cultivating different genres enter into dialogue? Do the relationships between word and image continue mutating? What are the narratives of the Anthropocene? What type of commitment can creators assume before a crisis of unseen proportions? The K Dialogues are conversations with prominent authors on key themes in their work, in today's literature, that of our times.

Thinking in Strips

To stop climate change we need a radical change of mindset that involves a social, cultural and economic change. At K17 we'll be presenting a special programme of lectures, performances and debates where we will defend the extensive, far-reaching and not always visible female creativity and putting on the table some of the hottest issues, such as motherhood, ageing and prejudices towards literature written by women.

This last turn of the century has seen the normalisation of the production and reading of graphic novels that tell fictional tales as well as autobiographic, journalistic and even essayistic stories. At K17 we will be bringing together four of the top international exponents of graphic novels who have worked particularly on relations between the documentary and fiction through complex narrative architectures, with the will of thinking seriously and with a great visual imagination.

The Walk by Robert Walser

Networked Literature

In 1917 the first edition of *The Walk* by Robert Walser was published. In this short novel the author updates the figure of the *flâneur*, a thinking stroller who as he walked analysed the impressions caused by the surrounding environment. K17 pays tribute to the novel's centenary with three Walserian walks and with a discussion about how the text – and its representation and amplification on the street – breaks the boundaries between reality and fiction and between memories and the registering of these memories.
